Among the priceless art treasures to see are the beautifully proportioned Venus de Milo, Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa and the Winged Victory of Samothrace. FRI, JUN 2

PARIS - NORMANDY

After breakfast, say goodbye to Paris and travel to the Palace of Versailles, home of Louis XIV, the Sun King. See the magnificent Hall of Mirrors and imagine it filled with silk gowns and powdered wigs, lit by thousands of candles. The mirrors, a luxurious rarity at the time, were a reflection of a time when aristocrats felt good about their looks and their fortunes. In another age altogether, this was the room in which the Treaty of Versailles was signed, ending World War I. Stroll through the fabulous formal gardens and marvel at the splendor in which royalty lived. Continue to the Normandy Area. B, D

NORMANDY

Embark on a full day guided sightseeing tour of the landing beaches, including Ranville Cemetery, Longuessur-Mer gun

battery, Omaha Beach, the Normandy American Cemetery and Arromanches, including a documentary feature at the Arromanches 360 Circular Cinema. Stop at the Pegasus Bridge and visit a bunker at Pointe du Hoc from which German artillery fire rained down on US Army Rangers who were trying to scale the cliffs. Tour Utah Beach and Sainte-Mere-Eglise. B, D

SUN, JUN 4

This morning take the ferry to Portsmouth. Continue to London. Using your 2-Day Tube pass transfer to the Tower of London, a historic castle off the north bank of the River Thames. Visit this majestic piece of history that was founded during the Norman Conquest of England in 1066 and was finished by William the Conqueror in 1078. See the famous Yeoman Warders, also known as the Beefeaters, who faithfully guard the tower. B, D

MON, JUN 5

Visit the renowned Westminster Abbey, site of numerous royal weddings and coronations. See Poets' Corner with its monuments to Chaucer, Dickens, Longfellow, Hardy and other literary notables. Next, experience The Churchill War Rooms, the museum comprises the Cabinet War Rooms, a historic underground complex that housed a British government command centre throughout the Second World War, and the Churchill Museum, a biographical museum exploring the life of British statesman Winston Churchill. B, D

TUE, JUN 6

Experience a journey to Warwick Castle, a medieval castle developed from a wooden fort, built by William the Conqueror in 1068. Warwick Castle became one of the best known strongholds during the Hundred Years War, when it served as an example for many military stone castles that were created in 14th and 15th century. During its thousand year long history, several families served as the custodians of the Warwick Castle. Tightly connected to the crown, this castle played a pivotal role in the advancement of castle construction, it hosted nobility from all around the world, served as a playing ground to the famous knight games that became integral part of the European medieval history. Visit its walls, keeps, stables, gardens, and see the largest working trebuchet in the world. Return to London. B, D
